Online Learning Guide - Parents

Dear Parents and Carers,

This guide has been created to give you all of the information you might need during distance learning and to answer some frequently asked questions. Also included is a resource list of websites for additional support and activities.

Accessing Google Classroom

To access learning, you will need a computer or tablet device with an internet connection. Google Classroom can be accessed using an app which can be downloaded for free, or through the website classroom.google.com

You will have been sent your child/ren's login details via email. If you have not received these, please contact your class teacher via your class email.

When you have logged in, your account should already be linked to the appropriate class, but if not, the joining codes are below:

EYFS: e4jfgjg

Yellow: sbbf4xy

Green: vpzcyfj

Blue: vmk7rtz

Indigo: dlbw daw

On the classroom will be the activities set for the day, along with details of how to download 'Kami' – this is an extension that you can download for Google Chrome and will allow the filling in of worksheets online and lessen the need for printing.

Timetables

Routine

It will be really important to establish a good routine. The reason we have been so specific about a timetable is to help all parents reinforce this. We understand that there may be occasions when a little flexibility is required and this can be communicated to your class teacher through the class emails. It will also benefit children to have a set bedtime and morning routine that would be similar to when they are attending school.

Organise a study space

It will be very helpful to set up a specific area for work. In this way, the children will associate that space with school work and they will find it much easier to concentrate. Their bedrooms are not ideal for this. Ideally, it should be a space where you can keep an eye on them and which has an internet signal.

Screen time

This is going to involve a lot of screen time. It is important for the children to take breaks when they can and to get fresh air when they can. I know that it will be tempting for them to use their games consoles when they are not working but I would strongly suggest putting a very clear limit on how much time they can spend doing this.

Behaviour Online

We will expect the same standards of behaviour when the children are online as we would at school. Poor behaviour online, including any unkindness towards other children, will be treated very seriously. Please remind your children to be respectful and appropriate in their communications with both peers and teachers alike.

Lesson Content

The teacher who has set the learning for the day will be your child's normal class teacher. Learning has been set so that they should be able to complete this independently or with a small amount of support when appropriate. In the younger classes the teacher might write the instructions for you to relay to your child, whereas in older classes the teacher will write directly to the children.

Sometimes their might be an accompanying PowerPoint, YouTube clip or link to a website, or to a specific lesson filmed online by another professional, if appropriate. For example, teachers may make use of videos by Ruth Miskin (Read, Write, Inc), Jane Considine (Book Talk and Sentence Stacking) or the government-organised Oak online academy. Teachers will upload learning by 6:00pm the previous evening so that parents have time to look at the activities should they wish.

Maths lessons will be pre-recorded by the class teacher to help in understanding some of the methods and new material and will be uploaded daily. Teachers will also be available throughout the whole school day to answer any questions through class emails, activity comments on Google Classroom and Google Classroom private messages.

Submitting Work

Depending on the work set, there could be different ways of submitting this. It could be a word document, a photograph, video, written comments or filling in a google form. Please submit all work through Google Classroom rather than through email as the teacher can then give feedback and send work back for editing if necessary. The assignments stay live on the classroom after the day they are due so that work can be submitted at any time.

Daily Google Meet

Every day, there will be a set time for children to join a class video call via Google Meet. The link will be posted in Google Classroom for your children to join. The purpose of this call is for children to talk about any issues they encountered in their work either that day or the day before. The teacher may address common issues that children may have had with work, or celebrate some of the positive work that children have completed. The daily timetable for calls is below:

Depending on the time, there may be some adjustments made to the timetable to allow children the time needed to complete their work.
