Topic Sticky Knowledge			
Science	Most amphibians and reptiles have four legs (apart from snakes), large eyes and gaping mouths. However, amphibians are able to breathe in water and on land.		
	Amphibians, such as frogs, toads and newts, have a delicate soft skin, while reptiles, such as iguanas, crocodiles and alligators, have scaly skin that gives their bodies a protective armour.		
	Most fish are 'torpedo' shaped with eyes at either side of their heads. They feed while swimming through the water.		
	Humans have five senses – taste, hearing, smell, sight and touch – that they use to help them to find out about the world around them.		
	Four of the senses are associated with particular parts of the body: taste – tongue and mouth; hearing – ears; smell – nose; sight – eyes, while the sense of touch is located all over the body.		
Design & Technology	A food source is the place where food comes from plants and animals.		
	Eggs come from chickens, fruit and vegetables come from all different plants, milk, butter and cheese comes from cows and meat comes from animals.		
	Seasonal food is something that is ready to eat during a particular season. For example, strawberries are a summer fruit.		
Art	The primary colours are red, yellow and blue. When we mix 2 primary colours, we get secondary colours. These are purple, orange and green.		
	Printmaking is making art by printing pictures, normally on paper. The advantage of printmaking is that lots of the same picture can be printed. This is called a print. Each print is not a copy, but an original.

Art	Texture	When a piece of art is not smooth and it feels rough or bumpy when you touch it. Sometimes art creates this feeling when we look at it.			
	Pattern	A design in which lines or shapes are repeated to create a decoration.			

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Stand-Alone Sticky Knowledge			
RE	A long time ago King Antiochus banned Jews from worshipping God. He ordered them to worship him. But God had given the Jews the 10 commandments (rules) and he had told them not to worship any other Gods. A small group of Jews called the Maccabees fought against the King's		
	army and won the war. The temple had been destroyed so they cleaned and repaired it. They lit a lamp as a symbol to show God was present in the temple. The oil could only last 1 day, but the lamp stayed lit for 8 days, this was a sign that God was with the Jewish people. Now Jews light a candle for each day of Hanukkah. During Chanukah celebrations adults and children play a special		
	game called 'Dreidel'. It's a game using a spinning top and coins.		
	Chanukah is an annual week-long celebration and one of the biggest festivals of the year for Jewish people.		
Music	In this unit you will listen to 6 different music styles! These are: Blues, Baroque, Latin, Irish Folk and Funk.		
Computing	Creating even a simple snack involves breaking a big task down into smaller parts; in computing, this is called decomposition.		
	The method in a recipe is a sequence of instructions – an algorithm in computer science.		
	Many recipes are quite similar to one another, e.g. the recipe for a peanut butter sandwich and a jam sandwich; in computer science, these patterns are recognised and used.		
	Creating a good video needs good technical skill, like keeping the camera steady, but also creativity.
