## Grove Road Pupil Premium Plan 2022-2023

The Pupil Premium is additional funding to help schools close the attainment gap between children from low-income and other isadvantaged families and their peers. If a child has been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point over the past 6 years or has been continuously poked after for at least 6 months (LAC) the school receives an amount per head within their budget. A provision is also made for children who have a parent in the armed services.

Frove Road Primary School is committed to ensuring maximum progress for all groups of children and strives to close any gaps by addressing inequalities and aising attainment of those students in low-income families. Targeted additional support strategies are planned to result in every pupil, being able to have full coess to our curriculum and all our extra-curricular experiences.
