Science	Amphibians usually lay eggs in water. Their young go through different forms before looking like an adult. There is no parental care.				
	Mammals give birth to live young, they look like their parent and the female provides milk for their young.				
	Insects usually hatch from eggs. Some grow into adults but most go through metamorphosis.				
	Birds lay eggs and young hatch from them. They grow into adults and after hatching they are cared for by their parents.				
	For most animals which live on the land, offspring are fertilised inside the mother's body. This happens in 1 of 3 ways: The young develop inside the female and are born alive (most mammals). For others, fertilised eggs are laid outside the female's body and develop in the egg getting nourishment from the yolk. In some animals the eggs are held within the female and hatch as they are laid e.g. a fruit fly.				
	David Attenborough is a British wildlife filmmaker and naturalist. This means he is a scientist who studies animals and their behaviour. He has written and presented many popular documentaries about animals and their lives.				
	Jane Goodall is a British scientist who has studied chimpanzees for many years. She is considered to be the world expert on chimpanzees and their behaviour.				
Geography	The global supply chain maps the different places a product and its parts come from, and travel to, on its way to the consumer (the person who is buying the product).				
	The UK trades a lot of goods and services. Some of the goods the UK exports are: scrap iron, medicines, aircraft parts, cars, computers, oil and gas. Some of the goods the UK imports are: coffee beans, bananas, medicines, aircraft parts, cars, computers, oil and fuel.				
Design & Technology	Seasonal food is the time of year when food is at its best, in terms of flavour or harvest. Many foods are available all year, as they are imported from other countries. When local seasonal food is available it tends to be fresher and cheaper - there has been less travel/storage from farm to fork				
	Foods are usually harvested when they are at their peak and typically have the most flavour and nutrients, so the food tends to be tastier, healthier and better for the environment.				
	A balanced diet consists of measured amounts of different foods to keep us healthy. Use the NHS Eatwell Guide to see how much you should eat from each food group.				
	In farming, it is important that the animals are cared for properly during their lifetime. There are ethical rules which ensure that the animals receive a good level of welfare.
