Topic Sticky Knowledge	
Science	Most amphibians and reptiles have four legs (apart from snakes), large eyes and gaping mouths. However, amphibians are able to breathe in water and on land.
	Amphibians, such as frogs, toads and newts, have a delicate soft skin, while reptiles, such as iguanas, crocodiles and alligators, have scaly skin that gives their bodies a protective armour.
	Most fish are 'torpedo' shaped with eyes at either side of their heads. They feed while swimming through the water.
	Humans have five senses – taste, hearing, smell, sight and touch – that they use to help them to find out about the world around them.
	Four of the senses are associated with particular parts of the body: taste – tongue and mouth; hearing – ears; smell – nose; sight – eyes, while the sense of touch is located all over the body.
Design & Technology	A food source is the place where food comes from. Food comes from plants and animals.
	Seasonal food is something that is ready to eat during a particular season. For example, strawberries are a summer fruit.
	Different fruits – apple, banana, orange, strawberries, grapes, melon, pineapple, kiwi Different vegetables – broccoli, carrots, leeks, turnip, cucumber, cabbage, sweetcorn, peas
Art	The primary colours are red, yellow and blue. When we mix 2 primary colours, we get secondary colours. These are purple, orange and green.
	Printmaking is making art by printing pictures, normally on paper. The advantage of printmaking is that lots of the same picture can be printed. This is called a print. Each print is not a copy, but an original.

Science	Amphibians	All amphibians begin their life in water with gills and tails. Examples are frogs and newts.
	Reptiles	Animals that are cold-blooded. Most lay eggs and their skin is covered with hard, dry scales.
	Mammals	Mammals are also warm-blooded animals. They breathe air and have a backbone.
	Birds	Birds have feathers and wings. They lay eggs and are warm-blooded animals.
	Fish	A fish is a scaly skinned creature with a spine that swims in water and breathes using gills.
	Omnivore	An omnivore eats plants and meat.
	Carnivore	A carnivore is a meat-eating animal that gets its food from killing other animals.
	Herbivore	A herbivore does not eat any meat, they eat plants.
Design & Technology	Ingredients	Any of the foods that are used to make a dish.
	Evaluating	When you decide at the end if something worked. In this topic, it will be if it tastes good!
	Fruit	Grown from plants or trees – contains a seed
	Vegetable	Plant or part of a plant that is used as a food
Art	Texture	When a piece of art is not smooth and it feels rough or bumpy when you touch it. Sometimes art creates this feeling when we look at it.
	Pattern	A design in which lines or shapes are repeated to create a decoration.

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Stand-Alone Sticky Knowledge	
RE	Judaism is one of the oldest world religions – Abraham is considered to be the 'founder' of Judaism.
	Many Jews will try to live by the 10 Commandments. The 10 commandments are a set of rules that tells them how to live their lives in a way that pleases God.
	Shavuot is celebrated by Jews to remember the giving of the Torah and 10 Commandments to Moses.
	Jewish people believe that there is only one God and that he made a special agreement with them called a 'covenant'.
Music	In this unit you will listen to 6 different music styles! These are: Blues, Baroque, Latin, Irish Folk and Funk.
	We can find the pulse in all of the songs that we are listening to. The pulse is the heartbeat of the music. The pulse helps us to decide how to dance!
Computing	Creating even a simple snack involves breaking a big task down into smaller parts; in computing, this is called decomposition.
	The method in a recipe is a sequence of instructions – an algorithm in computer science.
	Many recipes are quite similar to one another, e.g. the recipe for a peanut butter sandwich and a jam sandwich; in computer science, these patterns are recognised and used.
	Creating a good video needs good technical skill, like keeping the camera steady, but also creativity.

Computing	Algorithm	A sequence precise instructions or steps (sometimes a set of rules) to achieve an objective
	Decompose	Breaking a problem down into smaller parts
	Storyboard	A visual representation of the key scenes or frames in a video; one way of recording an algorithm visually.

	Audio	Sound – this could be speaking, music or sound effects.
