

School Council planned and prepared a successful UK Parliament week. Children all across the school took part in activities such as quizzes and debates.








Odd Socks Day

Parent Survey


Thank you again to the parents who completed our Parent's Evening survey, some of the headlines are below:

- 99% Strongly agree or agree that their child is happy at school
- 100% of parents believe their child is safe at school, with 63% strongly agreeing
- 60% of parents strongly agree that the school makes sure pupils are well behaved, with 39% agreeing
- 100% of parents agree or strongly agree that any bullying is dealt with quickly and effectively
- 100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school makes you aware of what your child will learn

- 93% of parents believe that concerns, if raised, are dealt with properly 58% of those asked strongly agreed
- 100% of parents agree or strongly agree that if their child has a SEND need, that the school supports them to help their child succeed
- 98% of parents agree or strongly agree that their child does well at the school
- 99% of parents agree or strongly agree that there are a good range of subjects available and that their child can take part in clubs
- 100% of parents would recommend the school to another parent.

There were also some wonderful comments shared, as well as some good suggestions to support making things better, which we are very grateful for. It was very heart-warming to know that our parent community supports us and believes in what we are doing.
