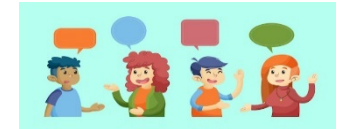
Gross and Fine Motor Skills

Children will continue to use different tools in the environment to develop their fine motor skills, including painting with paintbrushes, drawing with pens and pencils as well as using playdough for rolling, squeezing and making things. Children will continue PE lessons to develop their gross motor skills and develop balance and coordination.



Communication and Language

Children will again learn lots of new vocabulary throughout this half term and will be encouraged to use this throughout the day. They will continue to connect ideas together. They will engage in daily story-time sessions and will learn poems, songs and rhymes. Children will be encouraged to ask questions to find out more and to check that they understand what has been said to them.



Writing and Reading

We will be reading lots of different fairy tales with the children learning about the different characters and the similarities and differences between these.

We will be continuing to learn phonics this term and will be teaching the children the sounds and how to write these.

Please continue to support your child writing their names at home and enjoy reading stories together as a family. When reading stories to your children talk about the pictures in the book and ask them questions.



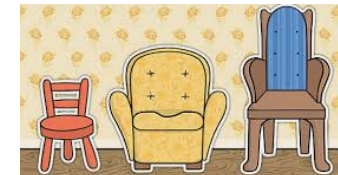
Red Class Learning Journey Summer 1 2025 Will You Read Me A Story?



Mathematics

The children will be learning about comparing different sizes within stories: largest, middle-sized and smallest. Children will continue to develop their counting skills and writing of numbers.

Continue to support your children at home by counting objects together and finding numbers when you are in the home and outside.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will be using the role play areas to dress up and pretend to be different characters from the stories we are learning about. Through this type of play the children will develop their personal and social skills as well as developing an understanding of their own emotions and those of others.



Expressive Arts and Design

Children will listen to music, dance and talk about music, expressing their feelings and opinions. Children will continue to learn new songs and will be encouraged to use instruments independently. Children will also learn about different types of music and use vocabulary such as fast, slow, high and low.



Understanding the World

Children will be learning about the differences and similarities between real life and stories. We will be learning about different roles of people and jobs they have in society.
