Children will continue to have PE lessons to develop their gross motor skills and develop balance and coordination.	Communication and Language Children will learn lots of new vocabulary throughout this half term and will be encouraged to use this throughout the day. They will continue to connect ideas together. They will engage in daily story-time sessions and will learn poems, songs and rhymes. Children will ask questions to find out more and check that they understand what has been said to them.
